District Goals for Student Achievement

- Increase student performance in all core content areas by 2% annually as measured by achievement data.
- CCSD will increase the participation rate of families and communities engaging in services/programs by 10% as measured by CLTS Parent data, survey results & web view module.

Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

Powers Ferry Elementary Teachers

Teachers will implement mandatory independent reading time in grades 3-5 and writing in mathematics to develop metacognitive skills (thinking) as they solve problems.

ELA Interventionists and Math Interventionist teachers will provide high-quality literacy and mathematics instruction to students (grades 3-5) in the lower 10% based on RI and Milestones scores daily for 50-minute block.

Teachers will participate in monthly trainings alongside District Literacy and Math coaches and professional development sessions focusing on literacy strategies with data gathered from walkthroughs and assessments.

Powers Ferry Elementary Families

All parents will have access to their CTLS Parent and ParentVue accounts to stay current with student assignments, progress and communication with teachers and school administration.

Read with your child and encourage your child to read daily, and talk to them about what they're learning in school.

Join the Parent Teacher Association (PTA), parent teacher conferences, attend school events and monthly parent meetings, Words With Wilson.

Powers Ferry Elementary Students

Students will check Student CTLS and classroom agenda, reading log, student goal sheets daily for assignments and communication from teacher.

Incorporate daily scheduled independent reading time to increase reading and comprehension levels.

Students will develop stronger phonemic awareness skills, increased encoding and decoding skills.
