District Goals for Student Achievement

- •By SY26, increase growth by 2 percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

Powers Ferry Elementary School Goal(s) for Student Achievement

- Increase the percentage of grades 1-2 students scoring Near Target/or Prepared in Writing by 10%, and by 15% in Numerical Reasoning, based on the Fall and Spring Beacon Assessment.
- The percentage of students in grades 3,4 & 5 scoring proficient in Reading and Math will increase by 5% as measured by the 2025-2026 ELA Milestones.
- By May 2026, 20% of multilingual learners in grades 1-5 will increase their overall English proficiency by an average of .5 proficiency points on the composite score of the ACCESS for ELLs assessment, measured in the 2025-2026 testing cycle.

Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

Powers Ferry Elementary Teachers

Teachers will complete reflection surveys to identify areas of writing they observed that are yielding growth and identify areas of needed improvement (next steps).

Teachers will engage in professional learning to explicitly teach the craft of writing to all students daily, as prescribed by the 120-minute literacy block.

District Literacy Coaches and Administrators will gather baseline data for implementation of writing to aid specific grade levels and teachers.

All K-5th Grade teachers will use the 5-Step Strategy for Solving Word Problems daily to increase students' conceptual understanding of grade-level appropriate story problems as indicated by monthly instructional walks.

All parents will have access to their CTLS Parent and ParentVue accounts to stay current with student assignments, progress and communication with teachers and school administration.

Read with your child and encourage your child to read daily, and talk to them about what they're learning in school. Utilize the Parent Resource Room at the school and check out educational resources to use at home.

Join the Parent Teacher Association (FTA), parent teacher conferences, attend school events and monthly parent meetings, Words With Wilson.

Powers Ferry Elementary Students

Will practice the following phonics strategies to demonstrate their understanding of upper and lowercase letter recgnition, graphemes and morphemes (Teacher states letters and students are able to transfer auditory form to print), segmenting and blending, decoding and word recognition.

Practice writing in math journal twice a week to improve on computing math problems and answering questions about math. Participate in daily DEAR time to improve reading stamina, fluency, and comprehension levels.

Read to self, to a parent or parent reads to you for 20 minutes dail and complete weekly homework assignments.
