Powers Ferry Elementary School Academic Goals

- Increase the percentage of grades 1-2 students scoring Near Target/or Prepared in Writing by 10%, and by 15% in Numerical Reasoning, based on the Fall and Spring Beacon Assessment.
- The percentage of students in grades 3,4 & 5 scoring proficient in Reading and Math will increase by 5% as measured by the 2025-2026 ELA Milestones.
- By May 2026, 20% of multilingual learners (MLs) in grades 1-5 will increase their overall English Proficiency (ELP) by an average of .5 proficiency points on the composite score of the ACCESS for ELLs assessment, measured in the 2025-2026 testing cycle.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Powers Ferry Elementary School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Powers Ferry Elementary School values the contributions and involvement of families to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Powers Ferry Elementary School will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.



Jointly Developed

Powers Ferry Elementary School invites all parents to complete the Fall school improvement input survey/evaluation to provide suggestions on the school's Title I program. All parents are also invited to attend the Spring school improvement input meeting to revise this parental involvement policy, our school-parent compact, building staff capacity professional learning topics, and the parental involvement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year. The plan is posted on our school Web site for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey that is posted online to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of the 1% reservation of funds for parental involvement. Parents can also give feedback during any parent meetings and activities during the school year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their parents and families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this policy. Powers Ferry Elementary School will provide full opportunity for the participation of Neglected and Delinquent proxy parents, parents and families with limited English, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

Every family will receive the plan during Parent-Teacher Conference week. It is also available on the school website and a copy is in the front office binder. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center. We will gladly mail the plan to you upon request.

What is Title I?

Powers Ferry Elementary School is identified as a school having a Schoolwide Title I program as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards which reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents a written parental involvement policy.

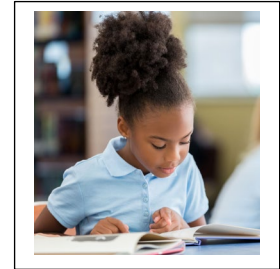
- By SY26, increase growth by 2 percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

Family-School Compacts
