- We hope to continue the same model for next year in combining student data and teacher input as far as scheduling for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8th grade. 6<sup>th</sup> grade will start as data, then move to both inputs like we did this year to allow teachers to get to know the students.

#### c. Gifted Resource

- We moved away from reading because of our scores were high, but things have changed since the pandemic. The needs of our students have changed, so we may consider a reading class to help bridge the gap for students.
- CommonLit would be the resource for the Reading class, along with a sructure and framework from the district.
- STEM and ELA lead teachers both feel like this reading course would be a great benefit for students. We also want to include our Gifted Resources students, who don't necessarily need the reading support.
- There are pros and cons to having Reading (teachers must be reading certified) over STEM. There may also be a AC reading to help with 7<sup>th</sup> grade gifted schedules and Gifted Resources.
- We discussed the specific <u>inferencing skill</u> would be a great one to involve in the Reading class because it would be a great benefit to students in their academic careers.
- Local east cobb schools are moving to Reading, so we would be in lock step with our local CCC.
- The question remains as to whether or not we keep Gifted Resources for our gifted students. This would be a family decision that our students can opt into. Offering 3 levels of reading (ONL Reading, AC Reading and Gifted Resources) would lock schedules, but may be beneficial for families and students.
  - a. Could we have a survey for students as to what they gained or experienced from the Gifted Resources class?
  - b. This would be expecially helpful for students who were in this course for 2 years
- Potential Foundation Initiative
  - a. Learning Commons
  - b. Steam Lab
  - c. First Step- Identifying Needs
  - Upgrades to the Learning Commons are on the Foundation wish list (carpet, plugs, new circulation desk, new maker spaces, etc.)
    - a. Mr. Tanner has a meeting today with the Learning Commons supervisor from the district to see what else we need
    - b. We discussed that having one focus would be helpful as members and Board Members change.
  - Upgrades to the STEAM lab- get rid of the older computers and allow the space to be used for more creating and groupwork.
    - a. This space is rarely used but could be a very valuable space.
    - b. This would be especially helpful for teachers with smaller classrooms.
