Grades: 9th & 10th are free at Allatoona for 2025. 11th graders pay \$12.

Type of Test: Standardized and norm-referenced aptitude test

Purpose of the Test: The PSAT/NMSQT measures the skills and knowledge that research shows are the most important for success in college and career.

PARENT/GUARDIAN INFORMATION

The purpose of this notification is to inform you of an upcoming administration of the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT). The PSAT/NMSQT is administered online using the Bluebook app from the College Board. Students will utilize their CCSD student-issued laptop to take the assessment during the month of October. The PSAT/NMSQT administration date for your student is indicated at the top of this document.

ASSESSMENT SCORES/RESULTS

Students taking the PSAT/NMSQT this fall, will receive their scores in the College Board portal (if they have a College Board account) by November 14, 2025. Electronic score reports will be available in the College Board portal beginning November 21, 2025. The PSAT/NMSQT gives students valuable practice for the SAT, it provides insight into how to prepare, and it opens opportunities for scholarships and recognition.
