



#### **General Information**

- School Hours are from 9:08-4:15
- Students travel to different classes
- Will attend 7 classes and have 7 different teachers
- Students will receive new Connections classes each quarter; music classes are year-long
- No more recess 😊

# **Course Placement/Scheduling**

- All students placed in academic classes based on our placement criteria (see website)
- Students can be moved out of AC classes once you receive course requests, but no waiving into AC classes
- NO EXCEPTIONS to placement criteria
- Although students may qualify for AC classes after their 6<sup>th</sup> grade year, we do not make mid-year changes
- Balance is key to managing stress, expectations, and adjustment to middle school schedule—it is
  ok to not be in all AC classes
- Students who qualify for gifted services will be served in their AC course(s). No more pull-out Target classes
- Students with an IEP will be placed in classes according to their plan
  - Mrs. Rachel Bloom (SSA) will be in the Learning Commons from 7:00-7:30 if you have specific questions



# **Math 7/8**

- CCSD notified parents of students who scored in the 99%ile on 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Math Iowa
- This is CCSD criteria and there can be no exceptions
- This was designed to get students who would have gone through the single-subject acceleration process into the 7/8 classroom sooner
- It provides students the opportunity to hyper-hyper accelerate in math
- If your child is in Math 6/7, they can still get to multi-variable calculus (you will double up in math at Walton)
- You will take 7/8 in 6<sup>th</sup> grade, Algebra in 7<sup>th</sup> grade, and Honors Geometry in 8<sup>th</sup> grade
  - Students will take Geometry at Dickerson instead of Walton
- We will send home resources and a skills assessment to help you make an informed decision and to support your child in the coming weeks
- Ms. Johnson and Ms. Whalen will be available in the cafeteria following presentation to answer specific Math 7/8 questions



## **Special Education Information**

- Students will be assigned an IEP case manager who will be responsible for conducting your child's annual IEP
- Once your student is assigned a case manager, he or she will be your point of contact for IEP related questions or concerns
- IEP and classroom accommodations will be reviewed and shared with your student's teachers before the first day of school
- Students with an IEP will be placed in classes according to their plan
- Mrs. Rachel Bloom (SSA) will be in the Learning Commons from 7:00-7:30 if you have specific questions



## **Course Requests Timeline**

- Course requests will be available via ParentVue in early May for all rising 6<sup>th</sup> graders
- If you think there is an error, you will complete a Forms link that will be sent out via CTLS
- Course requests are simply a list of academic classes your child will be taking, NOT courses that you request for your child
- Schedules will be released shortly before school starts and available at Meet and Greet (August 1)
- Connections classes will not be assigned until after the school year starts and after students rotate through each of the Connections classes

#### Flex Block

- It is a time to get additional help in classes or participate in additional enrichment activities (ex: PE, STEM, art, music)
- Meet every Thursday for 30 minutes
- Students will sign up for the block that they want to attend in StudentVue (this is a great opportunity to sit and have a conversation with your student before they sign up)



#### **Behavior**

- Students keep a behavior card in their agenda
  - Teachers will sign a student's behavior card for minor classroom infractions
  - Students may redeem their infraction with the teacher they earned it from
  - If the infraction is not redeemed, the student does not earn the FAF reward
- If a referral occurs, minimum consequence is in-school suspension (ISS)
- Celebrate students who do what they are supposed to do
  - Fresh Air Friday
  - Junior Raider Joe's
  - Students of the Month
  - Clean Card Behavior Winners—Gift Cards
  - Honor Roll



#### **Dress Code**

- We follow the District dress code
- Appropriate shoes shall be worn—no slippers
- Midriffs shall be covered
- Appropriate under-garments shall be worn and may not be visible
- Strapless garments and tank tops shall be worn with a jacket
- Caps, hats, bandanas, head coverings are not to be worn in school
- No pajama pants change from previous years
- Appropriate shorts/dresses may be worn—at least 4" inseams





## Cell Phones, Smart Watches, and Laptops

- Cell phones are not to be used during the school day—should not be seen or heard
- Students should not use their watches to scroll through their text messages
- Phones are available in the front office for students to use
- If in violation, student's behavior card will be signed
- If student is not feeling well, they should go to the nurse, not text parent
- School laptops are District property and can be revoked if used improperly.



#### **PBIS**

- We have school-wide expectations that all students must follow
- We expect our students to L.E.A.D. by example
  - L—Life-long learner
  - E—Empathetic
  - A—Accountable
  - D—Dependable
- Students who receive no infractions in a week, will be rewarded with Fresh Air Friday (FAF)
- Students who do receive an infraction, have an opportunity to redeem; if not redeemed, student will attend Reflection



#### **Buses and Dismissal**

- Bus routes posted before school
- You can find information on the CCSD website
- Have your child ride the bus the first day of school so they know their bus number, slot, bus driver name, etc.
- Students must cross at the cross walk with the crossing guard if walking home or to JFBC
- Have the conversation/plan with your child about how they're getting home
- Do not drop-off or pick up students on Woodlawn
- No bus passes (riding home with another student)
- Here Comes the Bus applies to Dickerson too!





# Middle School vs. Elementary School

- Homework—expect 45 minutes 1 hour per night
- HW is part of a student's class average
- Conference Week in October—will conference with one teacher
- 5 academic teachers instead of 1-2
- No recess or ASP
- Intramurals is offered before school
- Most clubs meet before school
- Familiarize yourself with CTLS Learn
- Transportation changes and no bus passes



### Lockers

- Lockers have not been used in any East Cobb middle school since COVID, and that practice will continue
- Students will still have lockers in PE, Band, and Orchestra
- Walton does not have lockers either
- Benefits of no lockers:
  - Increased instructional time due to less transitions for locker breaks
  - Decrease in discipline incidents
  - Less classroom disruptions as students have all their materials ready for class and don't need to leave to go to their locker





#### **Breakfast and Lunch**

- We do not serve breakfast
- Cost of lunch is currently \$3.50
- Purchase of additional items ("extras") is not monitored, so have that conversation with your child. Monitor My Payments Plus to keep an eye on it.
- No outside food or drink is allowed
- We do not deliver lunches left at home
  - Leave on a cart, and we will place cart outside of the cafeteria
- Parents not allowed to eat in the cafeteria with your student



## Clinic—Nurse Vanessa Moulthrop

- Students may carry OTC medications with proper form
- Nurse will be available during Meet and Greet for medicine drop-off
- Clinic form and emergency contacts





# **Laptops and CTLS**

- You will have the option to sign up your child to receive a laptop (usually in July)
  - They will bring it with them every day to school
  - They will keep the laptop until they graduate high school
  - Distribution of laptops will occur in the summer, during Meet and Greet, or during the first few days of school
  - Students will be given a laptop, protective case, and charger.
  - They should charge it nightly and bring their charger with them to school.
