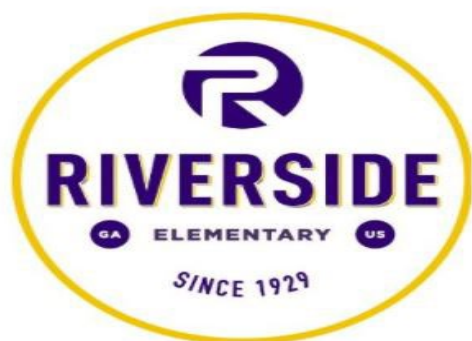

District Goals for Student Achievement

- By SY29, increase by 2 percentage points the number of students performing at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY29, increase graduation rate from 89% to 91% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

Riverside Goal(s) for Student Achievement

K-2 ELA Goal: The percentage of students in kindergarten through second grade with an Amira ARM score at the 50th percentile or higher will increase from 45% (62/138) to 60% (103 students) by the end of the 2026-2027 school year.

3-5 ELA Goal: The percentage of third-fifth grade students scoring Level 3 or higher will increase from 16.4% (31 students) to 40% (79 students) on the Milestones ELA Assessment by the end of the 2026-2027 school year.

K-2 Math Goal: The percentage of 1st and 2nd grade students scoring Overall "Prepared" will increase from 25% (43 students out of 170 students) to 50% (85 students out of 170 students) as measured by the 2026-2027 Spring Beacon Math Assessment.

3-5 Math Goal: The percent of 3rd through 5th grade students scoring in the Proficient and/or Distinguished Learner Range will increase from 28% (55 students out of 193 students) to 40% (77 students out of 189 students) as measured by the 2026-2027 EOG Math Assessment.

5TH Grade Science Goal: The percent of 5th grade students scoring in the Proficient and/or Distinguished Learner Range will increase from 13.7% (8 students out of 58 students) to 22% (13 students out of 58 students) as measured by the 2026-2027 EOG Math Assessment.

Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

Riverside Teachers

Teachers will provide parents with phonics or morphology skills being worked on in the classroom that can be reinforced at home.

Provide families with math resources, manipulatives, strategies, and web resources to support math proficiency.

Offer Title I events focused on our school goals. Riverside will offer Literacy and Math Nights, and Parent Workshops that concentrate on strategies to increase academic achievement.

Riverside Families

Families will practice weekly phonics or morphology skills with students at least 2-3 times per week.

Families will ensure math resources, manipulatives, strategies, and web resources are used for daily math practice with students.

Families will attend at least Title I event per school year, or get information from the parent engagement facilitator, academic coaches, or their child's teacher to help support their child's academic achievement.

Riverside Students

Students will participate in phonics and morphology lessons at school and review skills at home.

Students will share examples of math strategies learned in class with parents to review math skills at home.

Students will bring home flyers that advertise any school event and invite their families to attend. Students will practice with their families strategies and activities that were learned at the each event to increase academic achievement.
