District Goals for Student Achievement

- By SY26, increase growth by 2 percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

Russell Elementary School's Goal(s) for Student Achievement

- The percentage of kindergarten students scoring at or above grade level will increase from 22% (17 students) to 25% (19 students) as measured by the 2025-26 AMIRA.
- The percentage of 1st and 2nd grade students scoring at the prepared level will increase from 30% (56 students) to 32% (60 students) as measured by the 2025-26 ELA Beacon.
- The percentage of 1st and 2nd grade students scoring prepared will increase from 27% (54 students) to 33% (67 students) as measured by the 2025-26 Math Beacon.

Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

Russell Elementary Teachers

Communication

Teachers will use a variety of tools—such as CTLS Parent, Family Logs, and newsletters—to keep families informed and share instructional resources. These efforts aim to strengthen school-family partnerships that support student achievement.

Academics

Teachers will work closely with students to promote academic success. Families will be provided with academic vocabulary, reading and math strategies, and online tools to reinforce learning at home.

Engagement

Teachers will offer students engaging learning opportunities, including independent reading aligned to their interests, real-world math tasks, and hands-on science activities.

To further support learning at home, families will be invited to academic engagement nights, 4½-week gradelevel parent meetings, and will receive quarterly project-based science assignments to complete together.

Russell Elementary Families

Communication

Families will use teacher-provided resources to support learning at home and will communicate with teachers through CTLS to help build strong school-family partnerships that support student success.

Academics

Families will support academic growth by helping students study academic vocabulary, reading with them regularly, practicing math strategies, and using online learning tools provided by teachers.

Engagement

Families will create a daily routine that includes time for vocabulary review, at least 20 minutes of reading, math practice, and participation in quarterly project-based science activities.

Families are encouraged to stay actively involved by attending school events such as Open House, Academic Engagement Nights, Wellness Night, STEM/Art Night, Music Performances, the Thanksgiving Luncheon, Holiday Gathering, School Dances, PTA Events, 4½-week grade-level parent meetings, and Conference Week.

Russell Elementary Students

Communication

Students will communicate with their teachers by asking questions when they do not understand a concept.

Students will also talk with their families each day about what they learned at school to help build strong school-family partnerships that support their success.

Academics

Students will study academic vocabulary, read for at least 20 minutes each day, practice math strategies, and use online resources at school and home to support their learning.

Engagement

With the support of their teachers and the media specialist, students will choose books they enjoy reading. They will read daily, continue practicing math skills, and work with their families on quarterly project-based science activities.

Students are encouraged to attend school events with their families, including Open House, Academic Engagement Nights, PTA Events, and more.
