

WHAT IS AP CAPSTONE?

Two-year research cohort: Both courses = AP academic electives (**extra quality point**)

Developed in response to feedback from universities regarding **preferred skills** upon students entering college.

The two AP Capstone courses, with their associated performance tasks, assessments, and application of research methodology, complement the rigor of AP courses and exams.



AP CAPSTONE CORE SKILLS

Q – question and explore

U – understand and analyze arguments

E – evaluate multiple perspectives

S – synthesize ideas

T – team, transform, transmit

AP CAPSTONE CURRICULAR FRAMEWORK

THE AP CAPSTONE PROGRAM: 2-YEAR COHORT

AP Seminar (Junior Year): Exam score consists of:

- Team Research Project
- Individual Research Project based on stimulus materials
- 2-hour written AP Exam consisting of 2 essay questions

AP Research (Senior Year): Exam score consists of:

- 5,000-word Thesis

 (approximately 20 pages)
- Panel Presentation and Oral Defense

AP CAPSTONE DIPLOMA

- AP Capstone is College Board's only diploma program.
- Pass both AP exams in AP Seminar and AP Research AND pass four other AP exams in high school.
- Indicate to colleges through the Common Application "on track" to earn a Capstone diploma when applying for college senior year.

Strong writing ability

Self-motivation

Curiosity about the world

Interest in independent research

Ability to work with a team

APPLICATION PROCESS (DUE 1-10)

Application that includes 3 questions and a response to a writing prompt

Copy of one researchbased essay written for an English course over the past year

Two academic teacher recommendations

Other areas of consideration:

Grades in academic courses (must include Fall 2022 transcript)

PSAT scores (optional)

Panel review
