Beanstack is our summer reading platform again this summer! It's like a "Fitbit for reading" and is available online and as an app. The Summer Reading Challenge will begin on June 1, 2024 and end on July 31, 2024.

Beanstack makes it easy to track everything students read, whether it's a book, e-book, audiobook, or even the back of the cereal box! Students can see everything they've read, share reading with friends, and keep their daily reading streak alive. Students are motivated to meet their reading goals with new reading challenges and virtual badges. **Rising 6th-grade students will need to use their elementary school login to access the program**.

Summer Reading Assignment:

- 1. SET A GOAL! Current research says that students should be reading at least 20 minutes a day.
- 2. Read a text or texts from your grade level reading list.
- As you read, log into Beanstack and record your minutes (please see Log Reading on the attached Beanstack Guide). *Rising 6th-grade students will use their elementary school login to access the program.
- 4. When finished reading the text, write a review (please see Write a Review on the attached Beanstack Guide).

Assignment:

- 1. **Record your minutes-** your ELA/Reading teachers will be able to check them at the beginning of August.
- 2. Write a Review- share why you like or did not like the book. Please do not just write why you liked or did not like your selection. <u>Give at least THREE reasons why</u>.
- 3. Enjoy what you are reading. You can choose from a wide variety of texts.
