Cobb County School District's Goals for Student Achievement

- ★ By SY26, increase growth by 2 percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient and distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- ★ By SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

Sanders Elementary School's Goals for Student Achievement

- ★ Sanders Elementary will increase the number of Kindergarten through 2nd grade students performing on or above grade level from 56% May 2025 to 60% May 2026 as measured by the spring administration of the AMIRA assessment.
- ★ Sanders Elementary will increase the number of 1st and 2nd grade students performing on or above grade level from 16% in May 2025 to 20% in May 2026 as measured by the spring administration of the DRC Beacon Math assessment.

Teachers, Parents, and Students-Together for Success

Sanders Elementary Teachers

Teachers will provide families with resources through CTLS to support the Early Literacy Framework to build solid foundational literacy skills at home

Teachers will use CTLS weekly to communicate and will provide families access to instructional websites, learning resources, and instructional videos to address student needs in reading and math

Teachers will offer Family Engagement events focused on our school goals. Sanders will offer ELA and Math Nights, and Parent workshops that concentrate on strategies to increase academic achievement.

Sanders Elementary Families

Families will encourage and assist their child with school-provided resources at least twice a week for 15 minutes to practice phonemic awareness skills, sight words, and spelling with the child to build early literacy foundational skills

Families will use CTLS Parent to communicate with teachers, view school-wide posts, access websites, learning resources and instructional videos to support their child at home.

Families will attend at least one Family Engagement event per semester, or get information from their child's teacher, parent facilitator, or academic coach to help support their child's academic achievement.

Sanders Elementary Students

Students will utilize resources provided at least twice a week for 15 minutes to practice phonemic awareness, sight words & spelling skills to build early literacy foundational skills.

Students will access CTLS Learn and learning websites and resources to practice math and reading skills.

Students will use activities and resources from Family Engagement events to practice math, problem-solving, and reading comprehension strategies to support their progress in mastering grade-level standards and increasing academic achievement.
