Goal#1: By the end of the 2025-26 SY, increase the percentage of students scoring proficiency or higher on the ELA EOG by 3%.

Goal #2: By the end of the 2025-26 SY, increase the percentage of students scoring proficiency or higher on the MATH EOG by 3%.

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Tapp Middle School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Families can also give feedback during any Family meetings and activities during the school year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their parents and families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this policy. Tapp Middle School will provide full opportunity for the participation of Neglected and Delinquent proxy parents, parents and families with limited English, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

Every family will receive the plan during Parent-Teacher Conference week. It is also available on the school website and a copy is in the front office binder. Families can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center. We will gladly mail the plan to you upon request.

What is Title I?

Tapp Middle School is identified as a school having a Schoolwide Title I program as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards which reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with all parents a written parental involvement policy.
