Details on how to sign up for a conference will be in next Sunday's Eagle Update. Here are a few reasons that you should consider signing up for a conference:

- Your child has missing or incomplete assignments.
- Grades are below expectations (for example, below 80%) or have recently dropped.
- Your child is struggling to understand class content or needs extra support.
- School behaviors are leading to consequences for your child.
- They are having a hard time keeping up with the workload or balancing responsibilities.
- You've noticed your child feels overwhelmed, stressed, or discouraged about school.
- You would like strategies to support learning at home.
- You have questions or concerns about your child's progress or classroom experience.
- You have concerns about how your child is doing socially in class.
