Scoliosis Screening – Tomorrow, each student in 6th & 8th grade will have a scoliosis screening opt-out sent home. Please sign and return this form with your student by the end of the week. Middle school students who have regular well checks or doctor's visits do not need to be screened at school. Additionally, the screening experience typically feels awkward for adolescents in front of their peers. Therefore, we are encouraging all student to opt out of the screening. However, we will screen all students who do not return a letter as this is required by the department of public health. Please return the letter if you do not want your student screened.
