McClure Families,

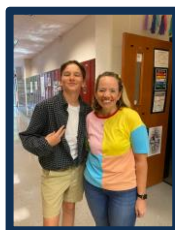

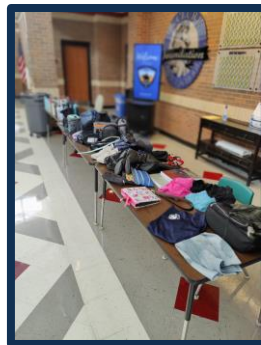
