Operational

Safety – As we are finding out across our state, rumors of a safety threat to a school can travel exceptionally rapidly through a community. At McClure, we take every reported threat seriously, and investigate to determine if a threat is potentially valid, or if it is coming from the circulation of rumors as it was this past week. Whenever there is information that is deemed to be relevant to our community, we communicate it out to you via CTLS. So, if you haven't heard from us, it is safe to say that there is no news to be shared, and if you really want to double check, call the school rather than asking your neighbors.

Safety at a school is more than locked doors and safety procedures. Safety is also how students *feel* in the building. While we at McClure have the responsibility for safety procedures, emergency protocols, and investigating threats, everyone in our community has a responsibility to assure students *feel* safe at school. One of the best ways to assure this is to limit the spread of rumors. We recommend the following protocols:

If your student brings a concern to you...

- Ask questions:
 - Did you hear/see it directly, or hear it from someone else?
 - Did they hear/see it directly? Are you sure?
 - Where did this happen?
 - When did this happen?
 - Was anyone else around to see/hear this?
 - Did you report this concern to an adult?
- If a threat seems legitimate, report it to the school.
- Wait to hear back from the school on what was reported.
- Until you hear from the school, remember to avoid:
 - Asking neighbors if they heard the same thing.
 - Telling neighbors what was reported.
 - Posting about what you heard on social media. These behaviors cause rumor spread, increase concerns across the community, and are not likely to help the situation or provide you or others any additional information.

If you hear about a concern from another adult...

- Ask questions:
 - Did your child hear/see it directly, or hear it from someone else? Are you sure?
 - Does your child know if anyone actually saw or heard it?
 - Did you report this to the school?
- If a threat seems legitimate, report it to the school.
- Wait to hear back from the school on what was reported.
- Until you hear from the school, remember to avoid:
 - Asking neighbors if they heard the same thing.
 - Telling neighbors what was reported.
 - Posting about what you heard on social media.
 These behaviors cause rumor spread, increase concerns across the community, and are not likely to help the situation or provide you or others any additional information.

Outside Food / Fast Food — At McClure we do not allow students to order food for delivery or allow students to eat dropped off fast food in the cafeteria for lunch. Lunch Funds – Have you checked your student's school lunch balance on My Payments Plus? Now that we have been in school for a while, it might be time to make sure they have funds available for purchases.

- Scoliosis Screening We will have scoliosis screening for all 6th & 8th grade students on Wednesday, October 16th. Your child will receive an Opt-Out Form Monday, 9/16 in homeroom. If you do not want your child to be screened by the school or your child has already been screened by his/her primary care physician, please fill out the Opt-Out Form and sign at the bottom. This form needs to be turned in as soon as possible. If you do not turn the official form into the school your child will be screened on October 16th. Due to county requirements, you must opt-out with the official Opt-Out Form. We cannot accept handwritten notes or emails.
- Library Media Specialist of the Year Each year, the Cobb County Association of Library Media Services honors a CCSD Librarian with the title of Library Media Specialist of the Year. To qualify the LMS will have held a Cobb County School District library media specialist (LMS) position for 3 full and consecutive school years, and the LMS will be employed in the Cobb County School District during the entire next school year as the selected reigning LMSOTY.
