## **Colleges and Universities**



### Considerations

- Requires a high school diploma or GED.
- Often requires a college readiness exam.
- May require advanced classes for acceptance.
- Requires that students are ready to be independent in their studies.
- Will need to ask schools to make accommodations and prove the need for accommodations.
- Determine whether the student will live on campus, off campus, or with family.
- Determine affordability and financial aid options.



# **Technical Colleges**

### Considerations

- Can get some certificates without a general high school diploma?
- Associate's degrees require a diploma or GED.
- Advanced high school courses are not required.
- Can train for a specific job/career.
- Less time spent in school/training.
- Not many options for on-campus housing.
- Accommodations available for those that qualify.
- Do you need a stepping-stone to a University System of Georgia school?
- Many financial aid options and can cost much less.

## **Differences Between High School and College**

- High School
  - ➢ Entitlement
  - IDEA
  - School is responsible for identification
  - School is responsible for evaluation
  - Decisions made by IEP team
  - School is responsible for IEP implementation
  - Parents act as advocates

- College
  - ➤ Eligibility
  - Section 504/ADA
  - Students must self-identify
  - Student must provide documentation
  - Student must request allowed accommodations
  - Students act as their advocate
  - No modification of material or small group



# Accessing Accommodations

- Technical College System of Georgia
  - Apply and receive acceptance
  - Self-disclose to the Student Disability Office
  - Provide required documentation
  - Complete intake session with Disability Office
  - Advocate for approved accommodations

- - Apply and receive acceptance
  - Review and/or visit each school's department that oversees disability services.
  - Submit required documentation to the school.
  - Complete intake meeting.
  - Advocate for accommodations.

### University System of Georgia



Documentation must come from a medical professional, dated within the past 5 years, that verifies the disability/diagnosis

• Example: psychological evaluation, a medical report from a doctor, etc.

## IEP or 504 Plans from high school

- This documentation is considered optional/not required
- This documentation is helpful but is not sufficient by itself



## Inclusive Post-Secondary Education Programs

### Considerations

- What do you want to do?
- It is a college experience.
- Can you commit to a two or four-year program?
- Need to be able to navigate a campus.
- Entrance requirements vary among programs.
- There are some financial aid options, but programs can be quite expensive.

In order to receive accommodations in college, a student must demonstrate that their disability impacts at least one major life activity. A major life activity may include learning, reading, concentrating, thinking, writing, etc.

## **Bud McCall Grant**

### • Eligibility Requirements

- Must have a disability that results in a substantial impediment to employment
- Must apply for services and become a GVRA client
- Must provide an acceptance letter for an accredited degree program at a college or university OR a degree, diploma, or Technical Certificate of Credit (TCC) program at a technical college
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) every year
- Must apply all comparable benefits for which the individual is eligible, including Pell grants, before applying the Bud McCall Grant to their balance
- Must submit updates to include grades, student account details, and class schedule each semester to their counselor to maintain eligibility

### • Grant Amount

- Tuition: up to \$7,395 per year Ο
- Books, room, board, etc.: up to \$9,430 per year Ο
- Books: up to \$900 per year Ο
