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
# What is a School-Parent Compact?

# **District Goals for Student Achievement**

- By SY26, increase growth by two percentage points, for students scoring at the proficient or distinguished levels, as evidenced by state assessments.
- By SY28, increase graduation rate from 87% to 88% as measured by GaDOE adjusted cohort graduation rate.

#### Varner Elementary's Goal(s) for Student Achievement

#### Goal #1

The percentage of students scoring at or above grade level for grades K - 2 will increase from 25.2% (81 students) to 30.2% (97 students) as measured by the 2024 - 2025 spring Amira screening results.

The percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring proficient and distinguished will increase from 37% (146 students) to 42% (166 students) as measured by the 2024 - 2025 EOG ELA Assessment

#### Goal #2

The percentage of K - 2 students scoring a rating of Prepared (Quantile) score will increase from 36% (117 students) to 41% (133 students) as measured by the 2024-2025 spring Beacon universal screener results

The percentage of students in grades 3 - 5 scoring proficient and distinguished will increase from 37% (146 students) to 42% (166 students) as measured by the 2024-205 EOG Math Assessment.
