

WORLD GEOGRAPHY

Welcome to World Geography! This guide will help you understand what your student will learn in World Geography and how you can support their learning at home. This course provides students with a global perspective on how geography influences human behavior, culture, politics, and economics. Course focus: Understanding the World Through Geography

Your child will explore world geography through six major themes: physical, cultural, political, population, environmental and economic geography. Each theme is explored through regional and global lenses, helping students connect geographic concepts to real-world issues.

PHYSICAL GEOGRAPHY Identify major landforms, climates, and natural resources across world regions Analyze how physical features influence human settlement and development	CULTURAL GEOGRAPHY Explore how language, religion, ethnicity, and traditions shape cultural landscapes Understand cultural diffusion and the impact of globalization on identity
 POLITICAL GEOGRAPHY Examine how borders are formed and how geography influences political power Analyze global organizations and conflicts, including separatist movements and international alliances 	POPULATION GEOGRAPHY Study population trends, migration patterns, and demographic challenges Evaluate how governments and communities respond to migration and population change
 ENVIRONMENTAL GEOGRAPHY Investigate human impact on the environment, including agriculture, industrialization, and natural disasters Explore global sustainability challenges and responses to environmental crises 	ECONOMIC GEOGRAPHY Compare levels of development and economic systems around the world Understand urbanization, trade, and the geographic distribution of industries and resources
